MEET PAT FINNERTY SSSF BOARD VICE-CHAIR

As stated in our last issue, Steuben Senior Services Fund (SSSF) is blessed to have an outstanding Board of Directors, all of whom are dedicated to our mission of "Empowering Seniors to Age at Home". They give excellent advice to our

staff and make personal sacrifices of time and financial resources to ensure that our small non-profit can continue to impact the lives of Steuben seniors for years to come. Most board members are retired and serve as volunteers, not only advising our staff, but also by completing hands-on-work to further our mission.

This quarter I am featuring Patricia Finnerty, member of our Board for 20 years, and Vice-Chairperson for much of that time and lead volunteer with our fundraising efforts. Pat has served SSF with enthusiasm and great dedication, along with many other fortunate non-profit organizations in Steuben County.

Pat recalled her happy childhood in Elmira as one of four children. She attended parochial school until the 8th grade after which she transferred to Southside High School. From an early age Pat enjoyed tap and ballet dancing and even dreamed of becoming a Rockette. She won a scholarship to Syracuse University and Elmira College, later becoming a high school and college math teacher. Through a college roommate, Pat met her future husband, the late John Finnerty, who served as Steuben County DA and Steuben County Judge. They lived in various areas of NY State, began their family by adopting Susan and Dan, and eventually settled in Bath.

Pat taught at Corning Community College for several years and ultimately was hired by Corning Inc. for her skill in information technology. She retired from there after 9 years of service.

Pat's extensive contributions to her community include a long tenure on the Board of Trustees at Corning Community College where she served as Chair, the Southern Tier Girl Scout Council Board, the Davenport Library Board and the Southern Tier Library System Board, 16 years with the Bath Housing Authority which oversaw the construction of Spring Meadow Apartments in Bath, and the St. Mary's School Board. In addition, Pat helped to organize the Republican Women's Club, served as Chair of the Wildflower Hills Association, and has been a Bone Builders Leader for nine years. In addition to this, Pat has been an active caregiver for her family members in their time of need.

Regarding her tenure with SSSF, Pat stated that she has always had a strong sense of responsibility, to help when and where she can. She believes in the importance of giving to others. Pat called what SSSF does "fantastic", and is excited to be involved in empowering seniors get what they need to continue being independent and to age safely at home.


